**The Pack**

The standard 52-card pack is used.

**Object of the Game**

The goal of each player

is to win the pot which contains all the bets that the play

ers have made in any one

deal. A player makes a bet in hopes that they have the best

hand, or to give the

impression that they do. The top combination of five cards

is the best hand and winner

for that deal. The winner gets all the chips in the pot at the

end of the round.

**Card**

**Values/Scoring**

**Straight Flush** This is the highest possible hand when only the

standard

pack is used, and there are no wild cards. A strai

ght flush consists of five

cards of the same suit in sequence, such as 10, 9, 8, 7, 6

of hearts.

**Four of a Kind**

This is the next highest hand. An example is four aces or f

our 3s.

**Full House** This

colorful hand is made up of three cards of one rank and two

cards of another rank, such

as three 8s and two 4s.

**Flush** Five cards all of the same suit, but not all in

sequence,

is a flush. An example is Q, 10, 7, 6, and 2 of clubs.

**Straight**

Five cards

in sequence, but not all of the same suit is a straight. An example is

9 ♣, 8 ♠, 7 ♣, 6 ♠, 5 ♣.

**Three of a Kind**

This combination contains three cards of the same ran

k, and the

other two cards each of a different rank, such as three jac

ks, a seven, and a four.

**Two Pairs**

This hand contains a pair of one rank and another p

air of a different rank,

plus any fifth card of a different rank, such as Q, Q, 7, 7

, 4.

**One Pair** This

frequent combination contains just one pair with the other three

cards being of

different rank. An example is 10, 10, K, 4, 3.
