German football executive and former player

Karl-Heinz "Kalle" Rummenigge (German: [ˌkaʁl ˈhɛnt͡s ˌkaːl ˈʁʊmənɪɡə]) Tj T*

former professional player. Considered one of the greatest German footballers, he was also the longtime Chairman of Executive & Board of FC Bayern München AG, a daughter company of German Bundesliga team Bayern Munich.

As a player, Rummenigge had his greatest career success with

Bayern Munich, where he won the Intercontinental Cup, two European Cups, as well as two league titles and two domestic cups. He also won two Ballon

Or awards, in 1980 and 1981.

A member of the West Germany national team, Rummenigge won t

he 1980 European Championship and was part of the squad that finished runner-up

in the 1982 FIFA World Cup and at the 1986 World Cup.

Rummenigge is a former chairman of the European Club Association, servi

ng in that capacity from 2008 until 2024.

Rummenigge was born in Lippstadt, North Rhine-Westphalia.

He joined Bayern Munich in 1974, coming from the Westphalian amateur si

de Borussia Lippstadt, for a transfer fee of ca. <10,000. He immediat

ely showed great strength as a dribbler. His scoring qualities were initially in

significant, but would find great improvement in later years, particu

larly after the arrival of coach Pal Csernai in 1979. In 1979–80, he scored 26 g

oals and became for the first time the Bundesliga's top striker,

a feat he repeated in 1981 and 1984 with 29 and 26 goals, respectivel

y.

With Bayern he won the European Cup in 1975 and 1976. In 1975, he did n

ot take part in the final of the competition, whilst in the year ther

eafter a glass of brandy sufficiently prepared the nervous Rummenigge

to contribute to the defeat of AS Saint-tienne. In the same year he becam

e also part of the team that prevailed in the Intercontinental Cup fi

nals against Cruzeiro EC from Belo Horizonte.

In the era of coach Csernai he found in midfielder Paul Brei

tner a congenial partner and he formed such a formidable one-two-punch that they

were only called Breitnigge (name invented by German newspaper Bild)

.

The club, then often dubbed as "FC Breitnigge", won in this p

eriod the Bundesliga title in 1980 and 1981, and the DFB-Pokal in 198
